EDUCATION PROGRAM BREAKDOWN (as of November 2018)

Throughout the year, we found it imperative to educate all of our athletes, coaches, parents and federations, with a major focus on younger athletes to keep in line with our goal of “Prevention through Education”. Our thought process is if feed them with the information early on so that there is a smaller learning curve in the future. Here are the activities conducted:

- ADeL Sign-up blitz with the Bahamas Swim Federation (swimming and water polo teams)
- Athlete and parent chats throughout August, September, October and November
- Launch of Clean Sports Week (November 5 – 10) during the Ministry of Youth, Sports and Culture’s Sports Month
- Series of radio and TV interviews throughout November to educate the general population on the importance of BADC and Clean Sports
- Updating of BADC’s website to include all pertinent information
- Creation of a BADC 45 second animation; information provided on how we test, why we test and when we test
- Creation of new BADC brochures – includes information on BADC, WADA, what is doping, the Code, the prohibited list, doping control procedures, TUE, whereabouts, ADAMS and rights/responsibilities
- Erection of BADC billboard on a main highway
- Meetings with federation executives and stakeholders on the doping control procedures and policies
- Anti-doping seminar with the University of the Bahamas’ collegiate athletes

YEARLY ACTIVITIES BREAKDOWN (as of November 2018)

Throughout the year, thus far, BADC has participated in the following activities:

- Annual iNADO Workshop & Annual WADA Symposium in Lausanne, Switzerland – March 2018
 - Dr. Jerome Lightbourne (Chairman of the Board), Dr. Anthia Carey (Secretary of the Board) and Petra Haven (Executive Director) attend the meeting with delegates of Anti-Doping agencies and organizations from around the world. We were able to understand new technologies in the doping control process, remaining compliant in the fight for Clean Sports, safeguarding our athletes, data protection, strategic testing and much more
- Continued partnership with Canadian Center for Ethics in Sports (CCES)
 - Test Distribution Plan consulting
 - Policy manual consulting
 - Training workshop consulting for staff and doping control team
- Testing agreement with USADA
 - Testing agreement to have the USADA Doping Control Officers test our testing pool athletes that reside predominately in the US
- Doping Control Officer training for blood and urine testing procedures with CCES in Nassau, Bahamas – March 2018
- Total revamp of BADC's brand, inclusive of website, brochures and promotional items
- Withdrawal from the Caribbean RADO
- Participation in the WADA's first Global Athlete Forum in Calgary, Canada – June 2018
 - Arianna Vanderpool – Wallace, three-time Bahamian Olympian and former U.S. Open Record holder, represented the Bahamas and the Bahamas Anti-Doping Commission
- Fostering better relationships with the sporting federations and commissions
- Creation of Clean Sports Week, in conjunction with the Ministry of Youth, Sports and Culture
