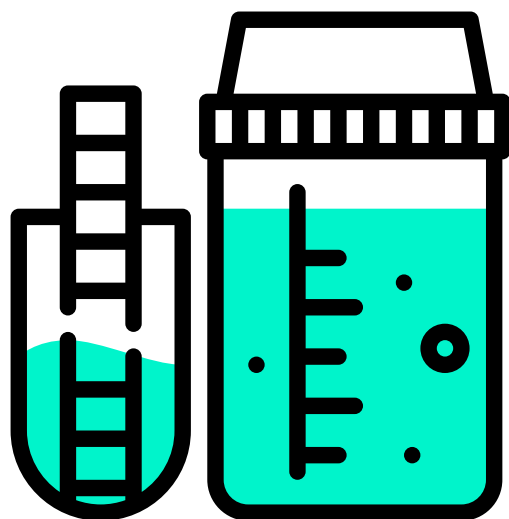


# **2022 ANNUAL REPORT**

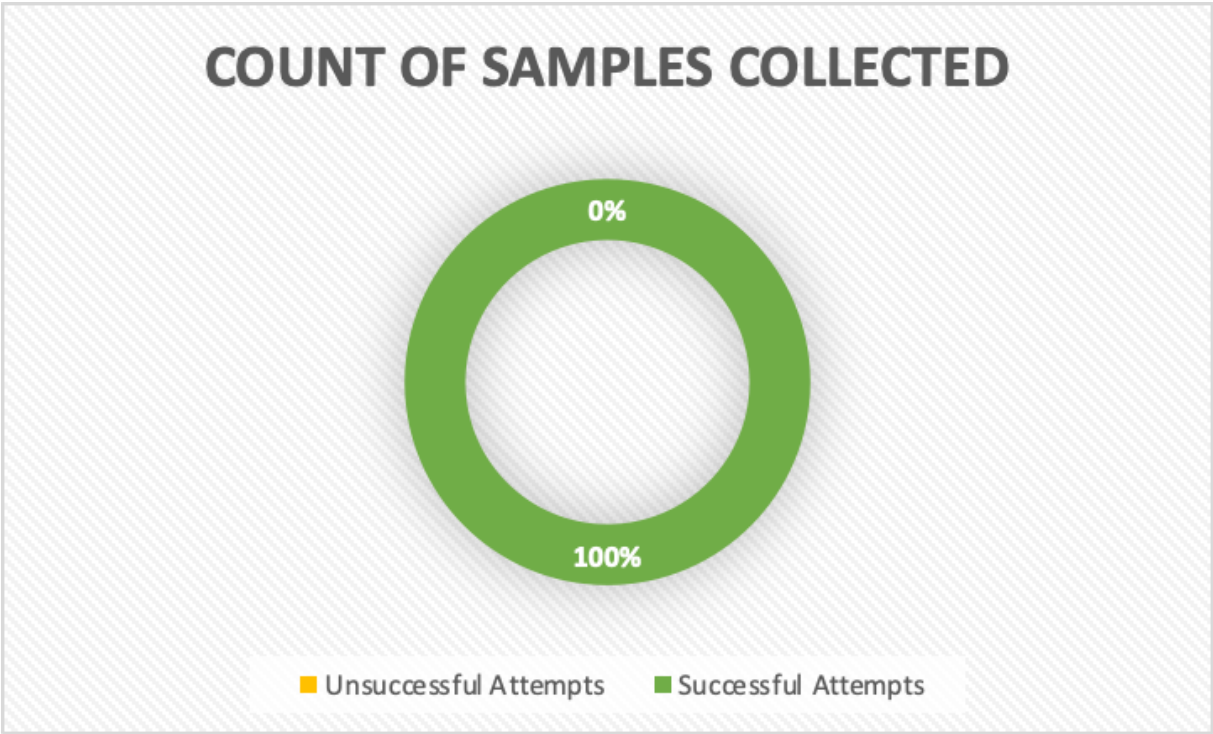




# TESTING ACTIVITIES

These tests served as a crucial step in upholding the principles of clean and drug-free sports, reaffirming the commitment to maintaining a level playing field for athletes.

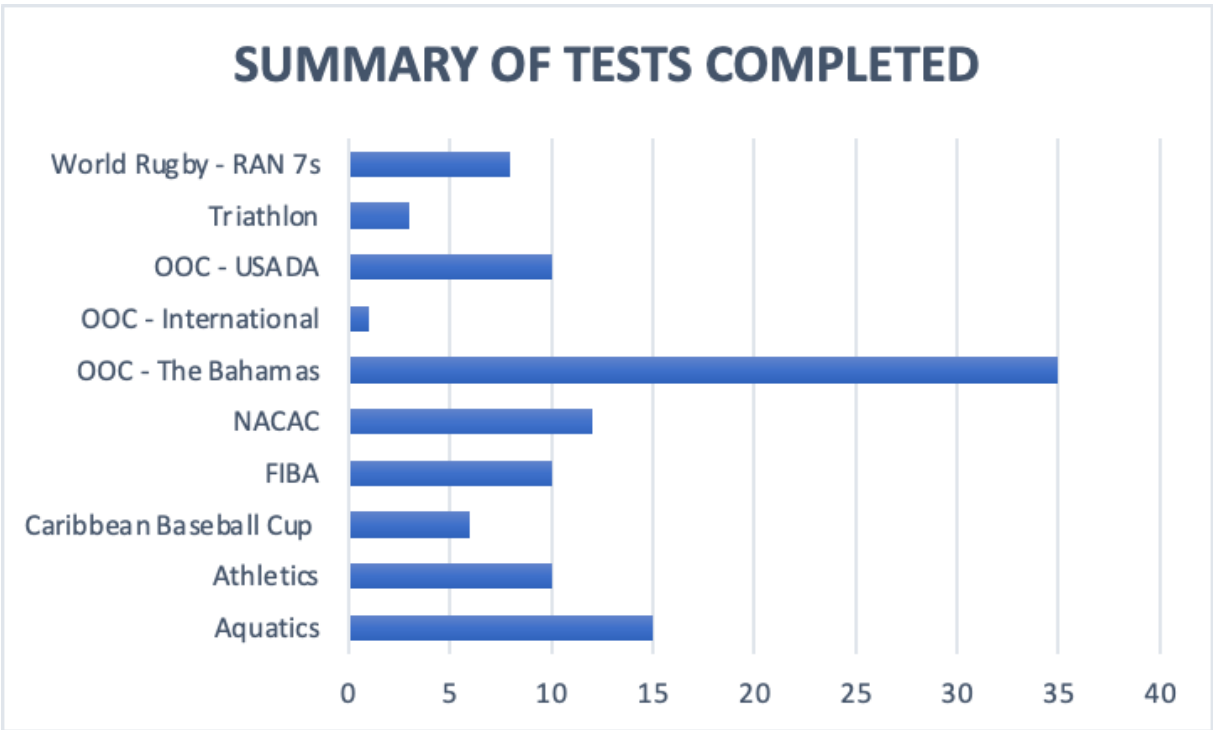


# COUNT OF SAMPLES COLLECTED

*Successful Attempts - 110*

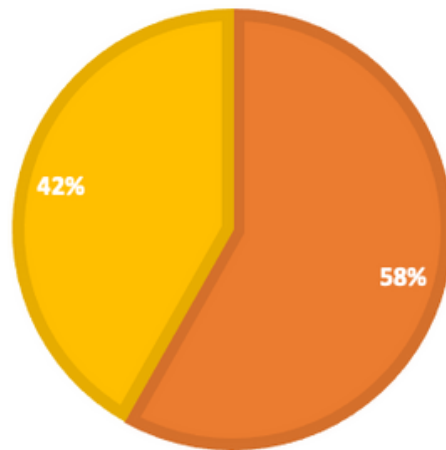

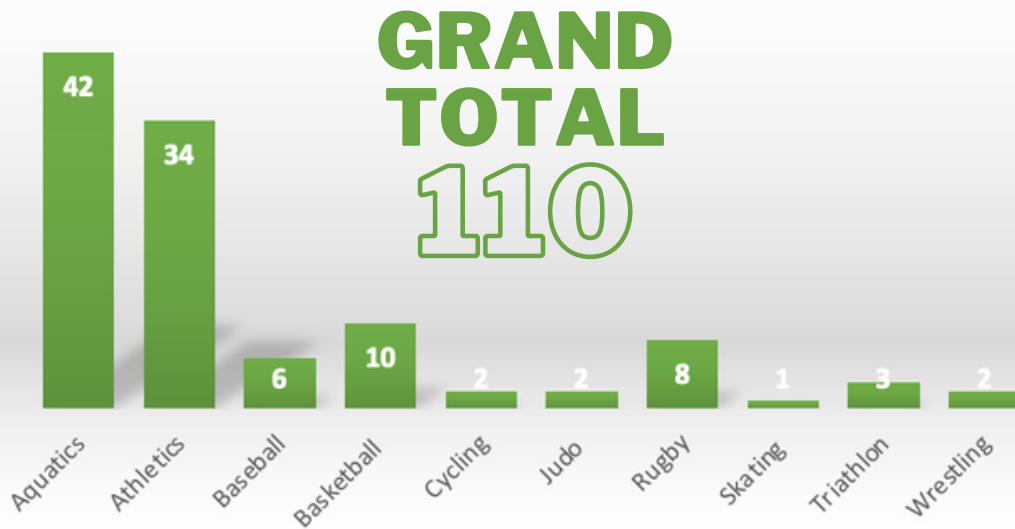


## IC VS. OOC

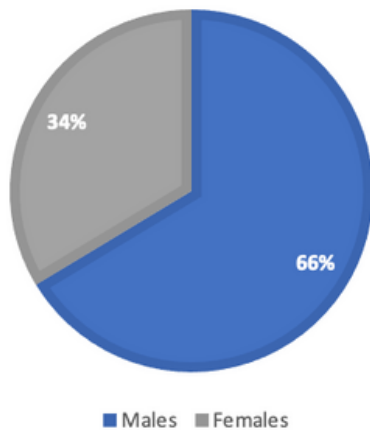
■ In Competition Tests    ■ Out-of-Competition Tests

## **Revenue Highlights:**

In 2022, The Bahamas Anti-Doping Commission witnessed a remarkable increase in testing income, reflecting our commitment to maintaining the integrity of sports in The Bahamas. Testing income surged from \$3,217 in 2021 to over \$30,000 in 2022, showcasing a substantial growth rate.

Furthermore, we are delighted to report the reinstatement of our pre-pandemic budget, with the Ministry of Sports allocating \$400,000 for our operations. This funding level restoration signifies a significant milestone in our financial recovery and our ability to continue our essential work.

## **Operational Efficiency**

Despite the unprecedented challenges and halting of Sports brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, The Bahamas Anti-Doping Commission successfully resumed normal testing operations in 2022, aligning with our pre-pandemic budget. This achievement demonstrates our resilience and adaptability in the face of adversity and reinforces our commitment to upholding the highest standards of fairness and integrity in sports.

## **Financial Performance:**

The Commission's financial prudence and resource allocation strategies are evident in our financial performance for 2022. Total expenses for the year amounted to \$296,000, reflecting effective cost management while ensuring the efficiency of our anti-doping initiatives.

As a result of our diligent financial management, The Bahamas Anti-Doping Commission achieved a net income of \$136,000 for the fiscal year 2022. This positive financial outcome contributes to our ongoing financial stability and enables us to reinvest in our mission of preserving clean and fair sports in The Bahamas.

## **Conclusion:**

In conclusion, the year 2022 marked a significant turning point for The Bahamas Anti-Doping Commission, characterized by substantial growth in testing income, the restoration of a normal budget from the Ministry of Sports, and the successful resumption of regular testing operations post-pandemic.
