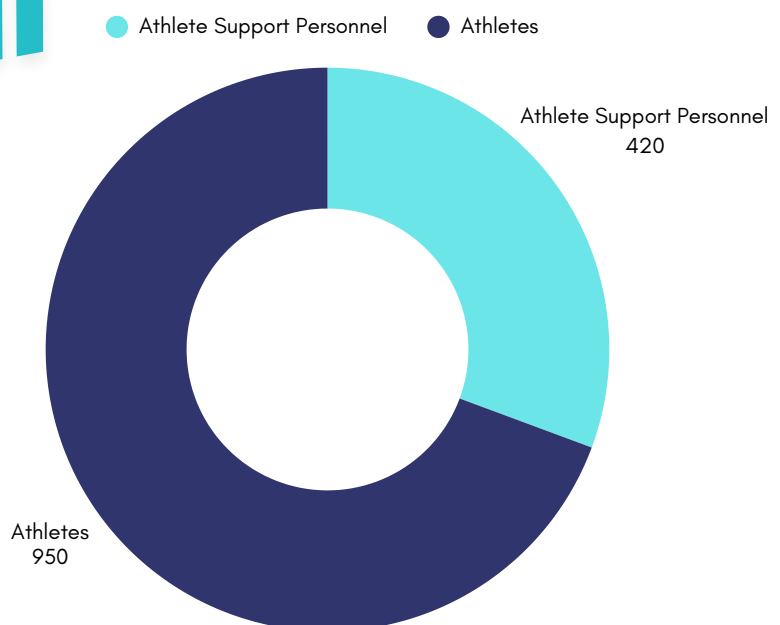
# EDUCATION ACTIVITIES

In 2025, the Bahamas Anti-Doping Commission (BADC) significantly expanded its national education footprint, delivering one of its most impactful anti-doping education programmes to date. Through a structured and strategic outreach approach, BADC conducted a total of 35 educational engagements across The Bahamas.

These engagements included 22 in-person workshops, 5 virtual Zoom sessions, and 8 interactive educational table activations, allowing the Commission to effectively reach athletes and support personnel in both traditional and innovative settings.

The 2025 programme reached approximately 950 athletes and 420 Athlete Support Personnel (ASP) — including parents, coaches, and key support staff. This marks an exponential increase from 2024, when 579 athletes and 103 Athlete Support Personnel were educated. The substantial year-over-year growth reflects BADC's strengthened outreach strategy, deeper stakeholder engagement, and heightened national awareness surrounding clean sport initiatives.

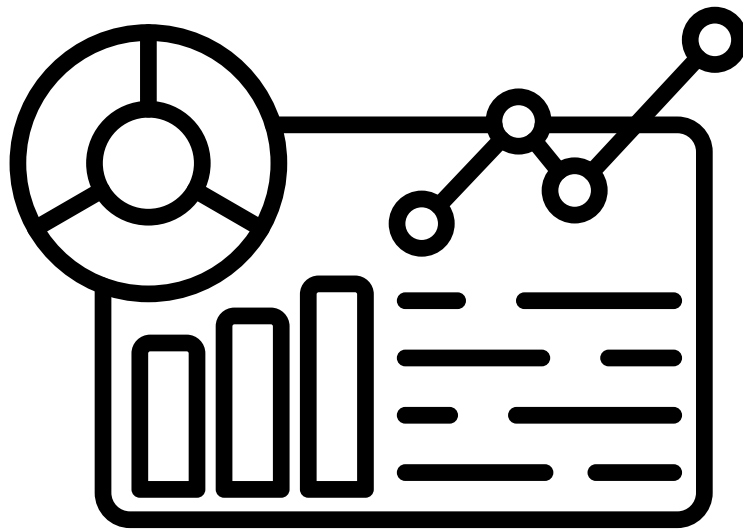
# EDUCATION ACTIVITIES CONTINUED...

Education sessions were delivered across a diverse range of sporting disciplines, including:

By intentionally engaging both athletes and their support networks, BADC continues to reinforce the principle of shared responsibility in anti-doping compliance. The 2025 education programme underscores the Commission's proactive leadership in safeguarding athlete health, promoting integrity in sport, and ensuring alignment with international anti-doping standards.





# TESTING SYNOPSIS

During the reporting period, a **total of 190 anti-doping tests were successfully completed**, reflecting the Commission's continued commitment to upholding clean sport. This **included 83 In-Competition tests and 107 Out-of-Competition tests**. Of the total tests conducted, 58 were completed locally, while 47 were facilitated by the United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) and 2 by the Jamaica Anti-Doping Commission (JADCO), demonstrating strong international collaboration in the execution of the testing program.

Blood testing formed an important component of the Out-of-Competition testing strategy, with **17 blood tests conducted** during the period. These included 2 tests in Athletics and 15 in Cycling, reflecting a targeted, risk-based approach to testing across sporting disciplines. The Commission continues to implement a strategic and intelligence-led framework to ensure testing remains effective, proportionate, and aligned with international standards.

With respect to additional testing information, two unsuccessful attempts or missed tests were recorded—one in Athletics and one in Aquatics; both athletes are no longer actively competing. **Laboratory results confirmed one Anti-Doping Rule Violation in the sport of Bodybuilding involving anabolic steroids**, resulting in a four-year sanction.

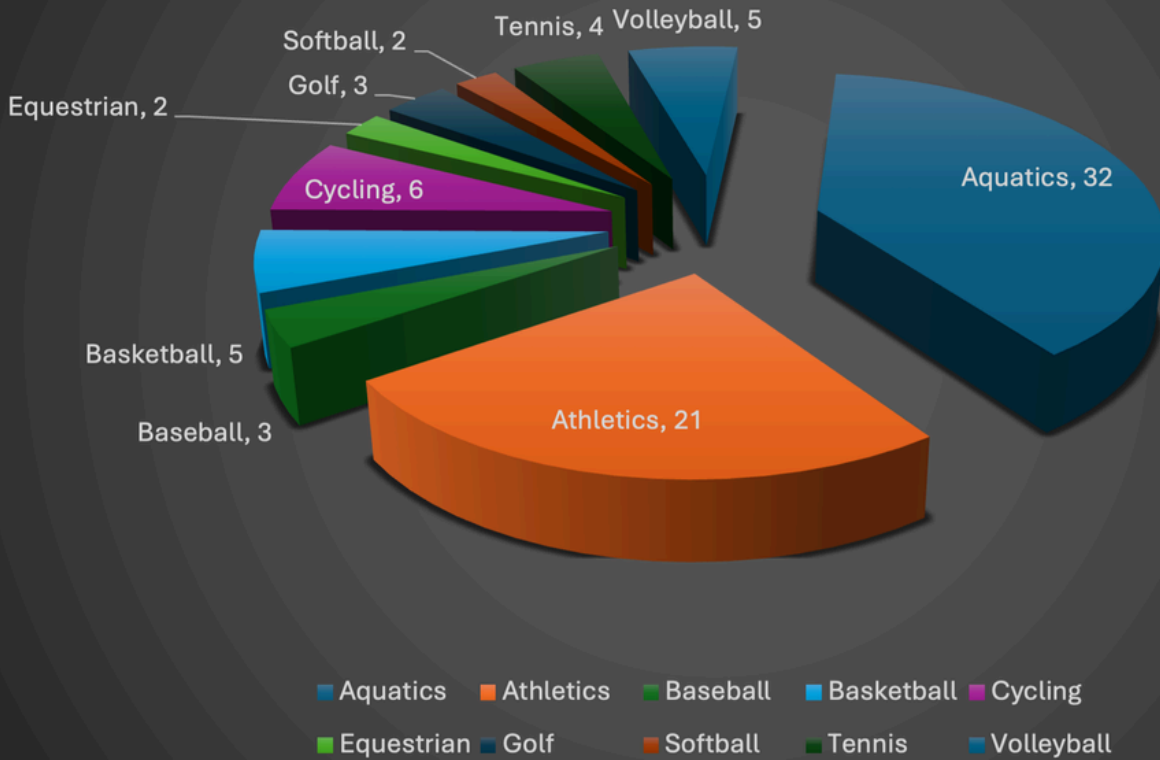

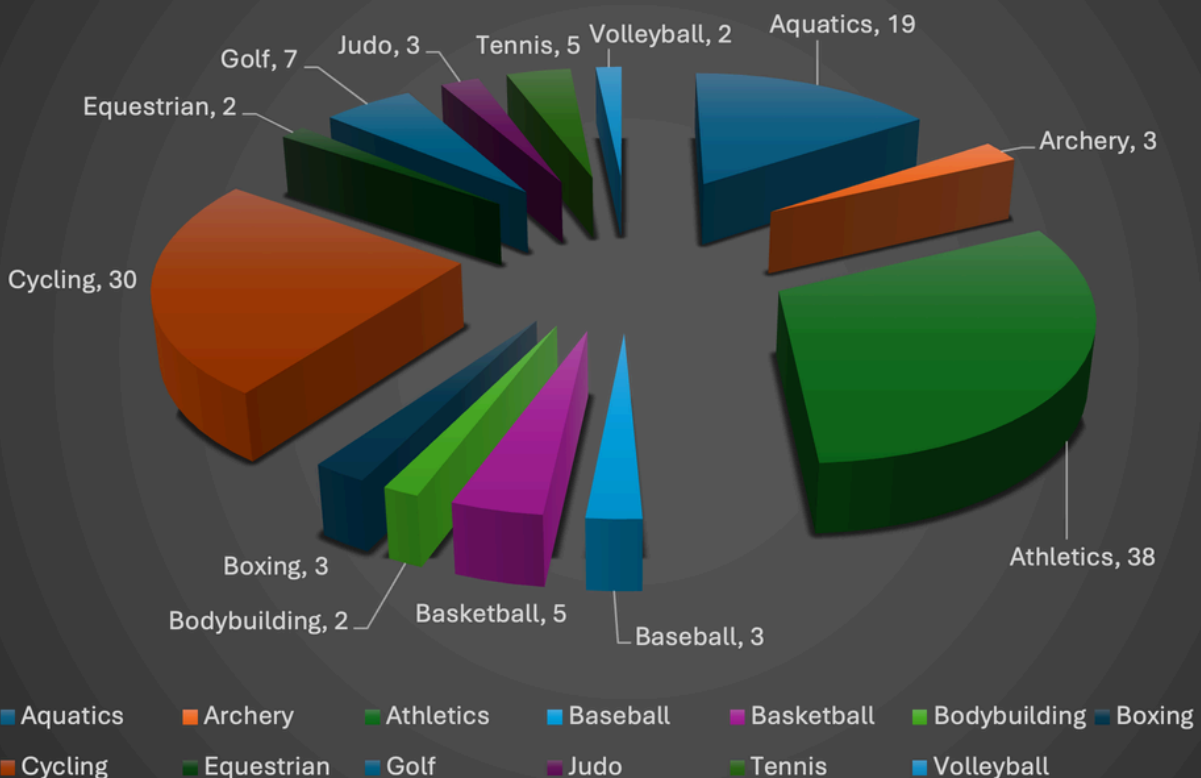
